School District

Iroquois West High School is located in Gilman, Illinois, which has a population of 1900 people. It is approximately 50 miles north of Champaign and 90 miles south of Chicago. Iroquois West High School serves students from the towns of Crescent City, Danforth, Gilman, Onarga and Thawville. Currently, the district consists of one high school, one middle school, one upper elementary school and two elementary schools. The student body consists of 1% African American, 5% multi-racial, 32% Hispanic and 62% Caucasian.

Twenty-six credits are required for graduation. The following credits are required:

Classes meet for forty-two minutes in length and are held five times a week for thirty-eight weeks.

All classes earn one credit per year. *Under certain circumstances only ½ credit is required.

**Students may fulfill the requirement by successful completion of Consumer Education or the State Proficiency Examination.

Weighted Grade System/Weighted Course

Course grades will be based on a four-point scale with an “A” equaling four points. Each course has been assigned a weight, which is based on the level of difficulty and prerequisites. The student’s Grade Point Average will be computed using the following formula:

(Course Grade Point Earned x Course Weighting) / Number of Courses

Weighted Courses (multiple of 1.4) / Unweighted Courses (multiple of 1.0)

Starting with the Class of 2020: Weighted Courses (multiple of 1.33) / Unweighted Courses (multiple of 1.0)

Honors classes are offered in English 1, 2, 3, and 4, Geometry, Algebra 2, Pre-Calculus, Biology, and Chemistry. Additionally, the following courses are weighted: Accounting II, Agri-Business Management, College English, Spanish III, Spanish IV, and Human Anatomy & Physiology.

Advanced Placement courses are being offered for the third year at Iroquois West High School. The following courses are offered for the 2017-2018 school year: AP Psychology, AP Calculus AB, AP Physics 1, and AP US History. AP is an open-enrollment program.
